What is EPA?

A guide to End point assessment.

As all of you are aware, end point assessment is the final step of your apprenticeship before you enter the big wide world of becoming a Gas engineer. The end point assessment consists of three different elements:

- 1. A knowledge test
- 2. Practical assessment
- 3. Professional discussion/interview

Throughout your apprenticeship you are learning the knowledge, skills and behaviours needed to become a competent gas engineer, and essentially your EPA is checking that. It is also an opportunity to showcase yourself and your newly learnt skills! Your portfolio will be submitted to the EPA assessor too!

The way in which you are graded are as follows;

- 1. Pass
- 2. Distinction
- 3. Fail

In order to receive a Pass grade you must achieve 80% on your knowledge test and pass your practical. If you don't achieve at least 80% on your knowledge test, you would fail and need to resit your test. If you achieve 90% or



higher along with the practical you will achieve a distinction. (The highest grade possible!)

How to prepare yourself!

- 1. Keep improving your communication skills- Talk to your customers, peers and tutors!
- 2. Keep asking questions, no question is too small. Your tutors are there to help you understand every step of the way!
- 3. Use your notes, gas books and reflective journals. Keeping your knowledge is key!

You will be take part in practical/theory training before sitting your EPA to help prepare you as much as possible.
